AAA Bike Rodeo @ the Library Saturday, April 15, 10:00 AM - 2:00 PM Rain date, April 22nd





Annual Meeting, Trustee Election and Budget Vote Tuesday, April 11, 2023, 3:00 - 9:00 PM

The Annual Meeting of the Harborfields Public Library will be held on Tuesday, April 11 at 2:30 PM in the Library.

The Budget Vote and Trustee Election will be held immediately following from 3:00 PM until 9:00 PM.

Absentee ballot applications are available at the Harborfields Public Library Reference Desk and on our website (www.harborfieldslibrary.org) on or after February 3, 2023. Such applications must be received by the Library Director at least seven (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. Upon approval of the application, an absentee ballot will be issued. All absentee ballots must be received at the Library by 5 PM on the day of the election in order to be counted. In addition to the vote on the proposed operating budget, there will be an election for the position on the Library Board of Trustees presently held by Jenny Shore. This position has a five-year term of office, expiring on June 30th, 2028.

Shackleton's Shipwreck With the Eco-Photo Explorers Wednesday, April 12, 7:00 PM

Eco-Photo Explorers will discuss the search for the recently discovered shipwreck, long lost below the ice of the Southern Ocean and, finally will take you to Antarctica on their own expedition. Antarctica represented the last great adventure in the golden age of exploration during the early parts of the 20th century. Three years after Robert Scott became the first to reach the South Pole, Ernest Shackleton launched a futile expedition to trek across the continent in 1914. The Eco-Photo Explorers will examine the story of this legendary journey, which was famously halted when the expedition ship Endurance became trapped in ice forcing the crew to survive the harsh Antarctica winter and subsist on meager rations for months on end in the frozen wilderness. The inspiring effort of Shackleton himself to pilot a small boat through 800 miles of treacherous waters to find help and save his crew is the source of leadership lessons that persist to this day. The Sinking of the Steamboat Lexington on Long Island Sound

This is a story about the 1840 accident that claimed the lives of 139 of the 143 people on board and remains the worst maritime disaster in the history of Long Island (Nassau and Suffolk counties). The disaster also marked an important milestone in journalism history because young lithographer Nathaniel Currier rushed to make an image of the fire for the NEW YORK SUN, which put out extra editions using the illustration, one of the first times a daily newspaper had an illustration with a breaking news story. 


