



Harborfields Public Library is dedicated to providing equal access to information, ideas and knowledge through books, programs, technology and other resources.



Shortly after the Broadway School closed in 1976, the library, only six years old at the time, moved into the building. The sense of honor and pride felt by our predecessors when they built this building has only strengthened over time. Through the years our many services, programs, materials, meeting spaces and dedicated staff have built upon the initial mission of 1924 and established the Library's place as the heart of a thriving community.



Digital Services

Our online training was enhanced with the addition of LinkedInLearning (formerly Lynda.com), offering 16,000+ online courses taught by real-world professionals. Tech-Talk offers technology training for the non-techie. Use Consumer Reports for product reviews, and Morningstar for investment research. Use Pronunciator for learning a language and Brainfuse for at-home learning, college research, SAT test prep and online tutoring!

Kanopy, Hoopla and Flipster continue to be popular for streaming movies, TV shows, audiobooks, music and magazines. **Overdrive/Libby** experienced an increase of over 10% from 2022.



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Communication is Key!



While our monthly **Newsletter** continues to be our primary way of advertising our programs and services, in 2023 our Social Media increased our electronic communication. In addition to **FaceBook**, **Instagram** and our **Webpage**, we enhanced our **eBlasts** of our monthly newsletter with embedded links that allow for "one click" program signups. We sent **20 eBlasts**, totaling **97,499 emails!** Our **Instagram** page had a reach of over **4,500**. Our **Facebook** posts had over **5000 visits** and had a total **reach of 42,971**!

Our Digital Home

Our revitalized webpage, now 3 years old, was visited 157,780 times in 2023. We continue to work on adding content and organizing the many services that the library provides into our digital home.

Perhaps most importantly, it is **Mobile friendly**. Over 50% of our traffic comes via mobile devices.



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NYS Construction Aide 2023

The Library applied for and will receive \$22,635 from the **New York State Library Construction Aid** program for **Electric Vehicle (EV) parking spaces**. A charging station will be installed for two vehicles on the Ann Street parking side of the building.






L LOCATION PLAN source






Building Improvements - Sustainability!




Building Improvements - Safety!


In 2023 we completed much needed repairs to our historic **Broadway Entrance Columns**. Using pictures from past graduating classes of the Greenlawn/Broadway School (1957 above) we determined that the columns were topped with a "Temple of Winds" design. Working with our construction team, we were able to find the exact design but made with modern materials.

Building Improvements




The **Broadway driveway** had not been paved for over 40 years, receiving only patches and sealcoating. This resulted in an increasingly uneven and hazardous parking area. The curbs and entrance aprons were also in poor shape. In 2023, the front circle was re-paved, **curbs repaired** and a **new ramp added** for accessibility.

New York State Tax Cap Formula

Last Year's Tax Levy = \$5,139,932

Multiply by: **Tax Base Growth Factor** (Per NYS Schedule for Harborfields Library District) **\$5,139,932 x 1.0014 = \$5,147,128**

Multiply by: Allowable Levy Growth Factor (2023-2024 Tax Cap of 2%) \$5,147,128 x 1.0200 = \$5,250,071

Add: **Carryover** (Determined by not utilizing last year's full Allowable Levy Limit)

Employee's Retirement System Exclusion

Employee Retirement System Salary Base (projection) provided by NYS: \$1,943,399 x .0010 (exclusion percentage) = \$1943
