David Clemens Incumbent Candidate for the Harborfields Public Library Board of Trustees

Dave's first involvement with the Harborfields Public Library was sorting books for the Friends of the Library book sale in an unused classroom of Harborfields High School. At that time the library was located in trailers in the high school parking

lot. He and his wife Joan have been members of the Friends for many years.

Dave is a retired librarian. He has worked in many types of libraries, but spent most of his career in public libraries. He is finishing his first term as Trustee of the Harborfields Public Library.

Dave has a lifelong interest in both history and libraries and has served multiple terms as a Trustee of both the Huntington Historical Society and the Greenlawn Centerport Historical Association. He is currently Secretary of the Board of Trustees of the Suffolk Cooperative Library System as well as a Trustee of the Suffolk County Historical Society and Chairman of its Library Committee.

Dave has been involved in our community for many years; as a Boy Scout leader he served as Cubmaster of Pack 225 and Scoutmaster of Troop 32 of Greenlawn. He currently serves as a Trustee of the Centerport United Methodist Church and Historian of the Centerport Yacht Club. His book *Centerport* was published by Arcadia Publishing in 2019.

Dave spent all of his childhood summers in Centerport and he and Joan became year-round residents in 1973. Their children James and Janet are both graduates of Harborfields High School and their granddaughter attends Oldfield Middle School.

Annual Meeting, Trustee Election and Budget Vote Tuesday, April 6, 2021 3:00 - 9:00 PM

The Annual Meeting of the Harborfields Public Library will be held on Tuesday, April 6 at 2:30 PM in the Library.

The Budget Vote and Trustee Election will be held immediately following from 3:00 PM until 9:00 PM.

Absentee ballot applications are available at the Harborfields Public Library Reference Desk and on our website (www.harborfieldslibrary.org). Such applications must be received by the Library Director at least seven (7) days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter, or the day before the election if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the voter. Upon approval of the application, an absentee ballot will be issued. All absentee ballots must be received at the Library by 5 PM on the day of the election in order to be counted.

In addition to the vote on the proposed operating budget, there will be an election for the position on the Library Board of Trustees presently held by David Clemens. This position has a five-year term of office, expiring on June 30th, 2026.




