#### Background

Top 10 Geopolitical Risks (As determined by the Eurasia Group)

- 1. 46\* Biden winds, democrat losses in congress and statehouses Calcified political polarization Declining global alignment Domestic challenges: Covid, immigration, inequality, economy International challenges: China, Russia, global order Questioned legitimacy of institutions
- 2. Long Covid Vaccine availability and distribution Disparate impact on communities and countries Stratified recoveries Anti-incumbent anger High public debt/interest rates Economic/political instability Long term impact on work, travel, real estate, tourism
- 3. Climate: Net Zero Meets G Zero—Warming temperatures Paris accords International climate actions/commitments Advancing technologies Competition and lack of coordination Clean energy supply chains and arms race Costs/constraints to private sector Lack of G leadership
- 4. US-China Tensions Broaden Bilateral tension spillsover to US allies Vaccine rivalry/diplomacy Green technologies and supply chains Re-shoring clean energy Less confrontational/more multilateral approach Continuing China provocations Increased danger
- 5. Global Data Reckoning Open global internet vs. government control of data Data as element of political sovereignty Innovation ahead of regulation EU restricts data transfer Limits on 5G and AI applications Disruption on international business models The new Great Game
- 6. Cyber Tipping Point Vulnerable devices/absence of diplomacy/instability in cyberspace Explosion of devices Internet of things Government malicious hackers Cyber tipping point NotPetya Russia hack caused \$10B damages Risk of miscalculation Quantum computing
- 7. Out In The Cold Turkey Economic policies hitting political base and patronage Brewing social tensions and crackdowns Support from Trump/Merkel fleeting Risk of pressure on Cyprus/Greece for support at home EU sanctions vs. need for investment S-400 vs NATO
- 8. Middle East: Low Oil Takes a Toll Covid induced drop in global oil demand Lower oil prices/cash flow Economic and political instability Regional balance impacted Sunni/Shi conflicts intensify US outreach to Iran Anti-Saudi sentiment Continuing regional conflicts
- 9. Europe After Merkel Merkel/Germany EU's strongest leaders Will look inward towards elections Expanding internal EU conflicts French leadership desires vs. realities Lockdown economic challenges Turkey tensions could increase refugee crisis/risk of military conflict
- 10. Latin America Disappoints Covid intensifies existing political/social/economic problems Limited vaccine availability and distribution infrastructure Growing inequality Uncontrolled migration Weak/failed governments spur populists' candidates Increased investment risks
- Red Herrings/Black Swans International realignments Big tech blowback Iran Other (?)
