## How to Get Involved

#### Check Out

Sign up for the HPL Seed Library every spring at our display, select your seeds, then "check out" at the Reference Desk.

HPL Cardholders may check out up to four types of seeds per family, per month from March to September, while supplies last.

Seed Savers Exchange and High Mowing Organic Seeds have generously donated their seeds. Please do not take the full packet. Use the provided envelopes to take a few seeds. Make sure to take a photo of the packet label to ensure you have the growing instructions.



We can also mail seeds to residents who are unable to come to the library. Please contact the Outreach Department (631-757-4200 x118) for more information.



#### Plant and Show

For seed sharing purposes, it is very important to keep records of the plants you grow. Send photos and stories of your garden projects to info@harborfieldslibrary.org or tag us on Instagram or Facebook (#harborfieldspubliclibrary) to help us build a network of community growers.

#### Share

We encourage you to share seeds from plants you've grown for future generations. We will be happy to accept your most healthy open pollinated (not hybrid) seeds along with as much information as possible about your crop.
